With Broadway shut down for the next several months, students have a unique opportunity to get personalized coaching on their acting, singing, dancing, and/or writing from Broadway professionals! These workshops are great for students who are applying to performing arts programs, as well as theater/singing hobbyists – they are designed to be fun and collaborative, not stressful! **No Previous Experience Needed!**

PROGRAM OVERVIEW



- Meetings are held approximately every week, at 9 a.m. Sunday morning (Beijing time) and last ~ two hours
- The group size is restricted to ~ 4-6 students and last for four weeks
- Program held June, July and August
- Students who attend the discussions regularly can list this as an activity on their college applications to strengthen their resumes.
- This is a great opportunity to practice speaking English during a group setting, which will help prepare students for college discussions and make new friends!

This is a great way for students to stand out from other strong candidates in the application process. The Broadway Workshop will help students wanting to apply for performing arts programs by giving them access to Broadway professionals that are seldom able to do coaching!

This workshop is also a wonderful opportunity for students looking to expand their horizons and show colleges that they are multidimensional applicants. STEM students can learn other skills like acting, singing, and dancing, while making friends in a new area of study.

The Four Week Broadway Workshop will include

- ✓ Vocal and physical warm-ups
- ✓ Acting games to work on technique
- ✓ Students rehearse a pre-assigned scene together from a popular Broadway show and get feedback on all aspects of performance from the Broadway Coach.
- ✓ (Optional) Students workshop a song and get personalized feedback from the Broadway Coach.
- ✓ Students give a final performance in the last session of the group scene and *(optional)* individual song that is recorded so students can share their talent with colleges.
- ✓ Q&A time with the Broadway Coach
- ✓ *Please note if a student does not sing / only wants to participate in the acting training, that is 100% OK!*
